To consider and if thought fit to approve the following Special Resolution.

SPECIAL RESOLUTION

To consider and adopt alternations and changes to the following Club Rules subject to the approval of the Minister for Consumer Affairs and Country Racing Victoria and Racing Victoria:

1. Definition of Chair

In the definition of "Chair" Rule "24.5" should be replaced with "24.6"

(This corrects a mistake in the original Rules)

2. Membership term

After the word "Membership" in Rule 6.6(a)(i), insert the words "for the period from the date of approval until the following 31 October"

(This is designed to ensure that the membership year runs until 31 October in each year, one week before the beginning of our season.)

3. Notice of meetings

In Rule 11.3(b) insert the words "Subject to Rule 36" before the words "The advance notice"

(This is to clarify the possible ambiguity regarding the service of Notice. 4. Committee numbers)

4. Committee Numbers

After the words "nine (9) members" in Rule 21.2 insert the words "or such higher number as may be determined by the Committee from time to time".

(This aligns process with current practice of having more than 9 Committee positions.)

5. Clarifying Committee terms

In Rule 21.3 insert after the words "...three (3) years ..." or such other term not exceeding three (3) years as determined by the Committee from time to time."

At the end of Rule 21.3 insert the words "... The intention is to ensure that one third of the Committee positions is subject to election each year."

Replace the words "Three Voting Members must be elected..." with the words "One third of the number of Committee members must be elected each year" in Rule 22.1.

(This is to clarify the current process of having only one third of the Committee retire each

year.)

6. Election of Chair and Deputy/s

Insert the words “at the first Committee meeting after the Annual General Meeting” before the words “The Committee” in Rule 24.6(a) and delete Rule 24.6(d).

(This clarifies the election of the Chair and Deputy/s to take place annually at the first Committee meeting after the AGM which aligns process with current practice.)

7. Application for Membership

Insert the words “and include the minimum information” and delete the words “in the form”.

(This is to give ongoing flexibility to the layout and data collected on the current membership application form.)

Season 2019 / 2020

It gives me great pleasure to share with you the Annual Report for the 2019 / 2020 season.

The club has continued to reach great heights in the past season with excellent attendances, increased fields and delivery of major infrastructure projects.

Of course the ongoing and evolving COVID-19 pandemic has dramatically changed the way in which not just the club but

Our season was unfortunately cut short owing to the outbreak of the COVID -19 pandemic. Racing Victoria made an early call on abandoning the last five Picnic racing meetings of the season, our Easter Saturday meeting included.

Having our season cut short did work in our favour as it allowed work to commence on the new watering system earlier than planned. The system is now up and running and we look forward to putting it to use in the coming season.

CELEBRATING OUR LEGENDS

At our meeting in early January we welcomed champion jockey Ron Hutchinson and his family and friends to celebrate his long and successful career in the racing industry.

The son of a Yarraville plumber, his parents were opposed to his wish to become a jockey but relented after Ron threatened to leave school. They agreed to a 6 month trial with Flemington trainer Claude Goodfellow with whom Ron served his apprenticeship.

The first of his 3000 odd winners came up on Busybody at the old Mentone course in August 1944 and his first Cup winner was on Spectre at Flemington in March 1945. In his career he won over 60 Cups and became known fondly as the "Cups King"

Ron was associated with grand gallopers such as Aquanita, Sailors Guide, Macdougall, Pandie Sun and Morse Code. He said the best horses he rode against were Bernborough and Tulloch.

After winning the Victorian jockeys premiership in 1958 / 59 Ron rode successfully in the UK and Europe. In 1964 he was narrowly beaten in the Jockeys premiership by Lester Piggott.

On his retirement from riding in 1981 he became a director of Lindsay Park Stud with Colin Hayes where his skills as a bloodline expert came to the fore.

Ron was inducted into the Racing Hall in 2005 and we enjoy having him here at Balnarring on a regular basis.

The DSAMP Objectives are:

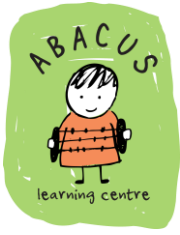
- To "Put smiles on dials", that is to provide a safe, and enjoyable surfing experience for people with any disability.
